### Remember the Human

- Do not say something online that you would not say to someone in person.



### Be ethical

- Everything you do has ethical implications – while not illegal, they reflect on you.



### Know where you are

- Rules vary from website to website – know what is acceptable for them.



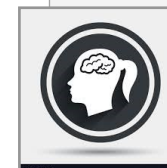
### Respect Time & Data Limits

- Ensure your messages are informative and concise, and are easy to load. 33.867 cm



### Make yourself look good

- Do not share illegal or inappropriate content; also, double check your grammar.



### Share expert knowledge

- It is easy for untruths, errors, and mistakes to become facts – be careful.



### Keep disagreements healthy

- Do not reduce discussions to personal issues or use inappropriate language.



### Respect people's privacy

- Do not share content with a third party before gaining the owner's permission.



### Do not abuse your power

- Administrators, do not abuse the privilege of access your position may give you.



### Be forgiving of other people's mistakes

- Forgive mistakes users might make; help them if you can.

**REMEMBER: the way you behave and act online defines the type of *digital citizen* you are – everything you do online is saved somewhere forever. 'Netiquette', or net etiquette, will help to guide your behaviour.**
